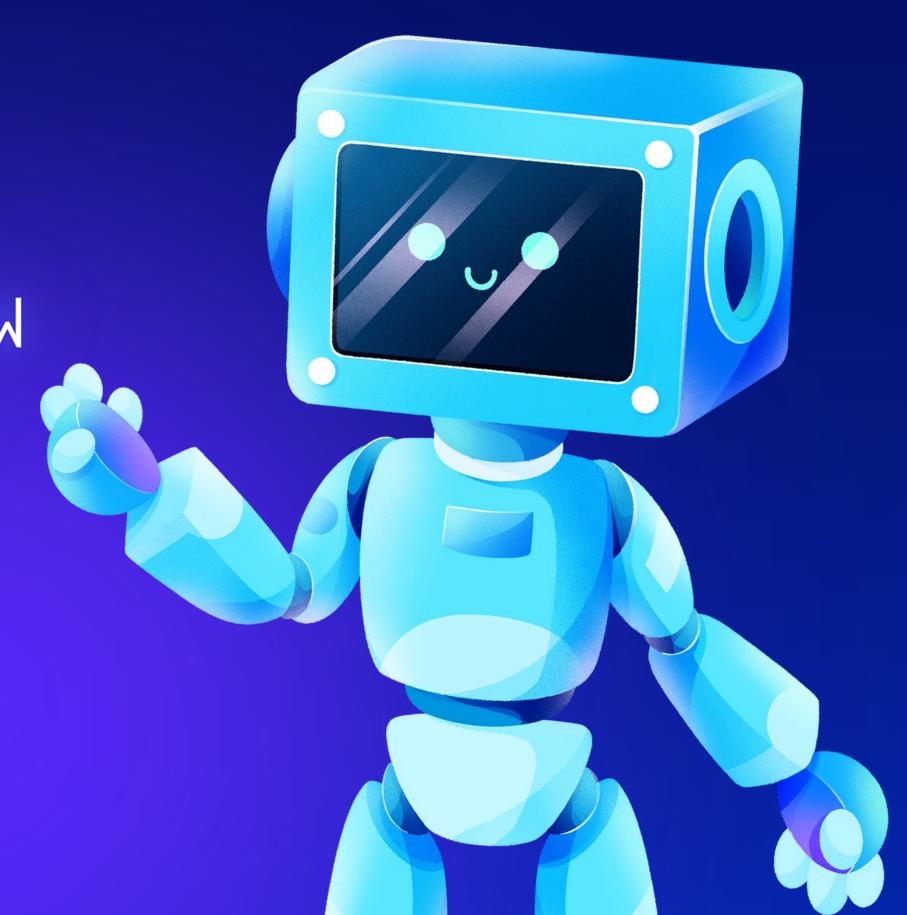

WHAT IS AI?



Generative Al

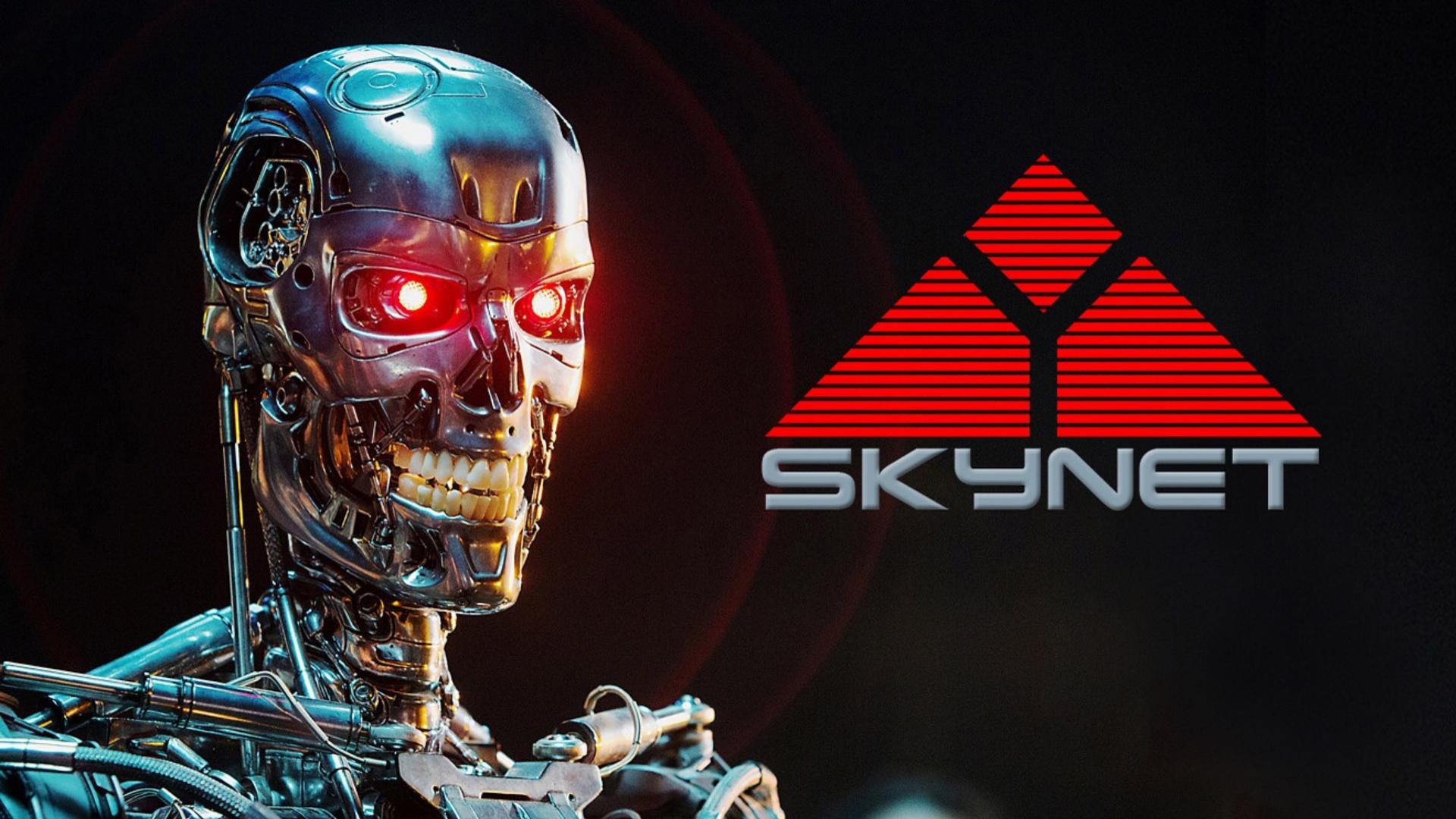
- Text, imagery, audio, and synthetic data
- Marketing content, books, videos, illustrations, voiceovers, articles, customer service chats, music, Willy Wonka Experiences
- This technology has been around since the 1960s but has advanced significantly with the introduction of generative adversarial networks (GANs) in 2014.
- GANs enable generative AI to create authentic images, videos, and audio.
- Recent advancements in transformers and language models have played a critical role in making generative AI more accessible.
- Transformers allow for larger models to be trained on vast amounts of text data, resulting in more in-depth answers.
- Generative AI works by starting with a prompt, which can be in the form of text, images, videos, or other inputs.
- Neural networks have transformed generative AI by learning the rules from existing data sets, rather than relying on explicitly crafted rules.

Generative Al

- The benefits of generative AI: automating content generation, reducing effort in responding to emails, improving technical query responses, creating realistic representations, summarizing complex information, simplifying content creation
- The history of generative AI dates back to the 1960s with early implementations like the Eliza chatbot.

Generative Al

- Some proponents of AI believe that generative AI is a crucial step towards general-purpose AI and possibly consciousness.
- However, there is no consensus on when AI will gain consciousness.
- Some predict it could happen by 2045, while others believe it could be much further off, with AI potentially reaching the intelligence of a dog by 2048.

- Dall-E 2, Midjourney, and Stable Diffusion for image generation
- Amper, Dadabots, and MuseNet for music generation
- CodeStarter, Codex, GitHub Copilot, and Tabnine for code generation
- Descript, Listnr, and Podcast.ai for voice synthesis

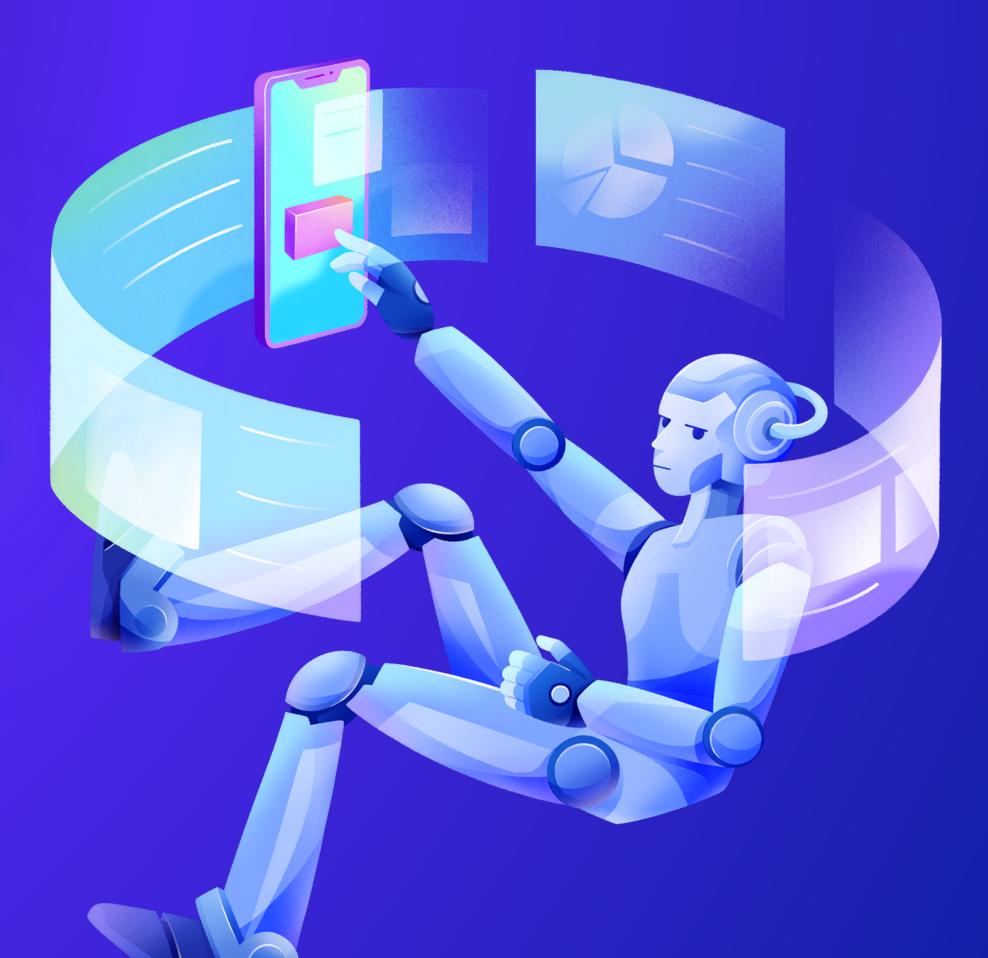

Deepfake Laws

- H.R.5586 DEEPFAKES Accountability Act
 - "Defending Each and Every Person from False Appearances by Keeping Exploitation Subject to Accountability Act of 2023" or the "DEEPFAKES Accountability Act".
 - To protect national security against the threats posed by deepfake technology and to provide legal recourse to victims of harmful deepfakes.

Deepfake Laws

- California: In 2020 the state passed a law allowing victims of deepfake pornography to sue those who create and distribute sexually explicit deepfake material if the victim did not consent to it.
- Florida: In 2022 the state passed a law that prohibits the dissemination of sexually explicit deepfake images without the victim's consent.
- **Georgia**: A 2020 state law banned the online dissemination of falsely created pornographic images or videos.
- **Hawaii**: In 2021 the state outlawed the intentional creation, disclosure, or threat of disclosure of nonconsensual sexually explicit deepfake images or videos.
- **Illinois**: The law allows anyone falsely depicted in sexually explicit images or videos to sue the person who created the material. Victims can sue for damages and, to maintain their privacy, can use a pseudonym in court.

Deepfake Laws

- Minnesota: A 2023 state law made it illegal to create sexually explicit deepfakes and to use deepfakes to influence an election.
- **New York**: In 2023 the state banned the distribution of pornographic images made using artificial intelligence without the consent of the subject.
- **Texas**: In 2023 the state made it a Class A misdemeanor to create sexually explicit, nonconsensual deepfake videos.
- South Dakota: A 2022 law made it a Class 1 misdemeanor to create deepfake pornography of an unwilling victim.
- Virginia: The state law was passed in 2019, as part of an existing law relating to revenge porn. The update adds "falsely created videographic or still image."

Detecting Deepfakes

Pay attention to the face.

- Cheeks and forehead
- Does the skin appear too smooth or too wrinkly?
- Is the age of the skin similar to the age of the hair and eyes?
- Eyes and eyebrows do shadows fall where you expect?
- Glasses Is there any glare or reflection? Does it move when the person moves?
- Facial hair or lack thereof does it look real? Moles?
- Blinking do they blink enough? Too much?
- Lip movements do they look like they're lip syncing?

Detecting AI Images - People

- Fingers AI is getting better at this, but hands will still often have too many fingers.
- Hair look especially at the edges of hair and where it intersects with other objects.
- Jewelry and accessories check to see if jewelry and other accessories are accurately placed.
- Too-perfect skin even compared to very filtered photos, AI just doesn't look right.
 The lighting and smoothness isn't realistic.
- Teeth too many, too white, too straight.
- Mirrors wrong reflection



Detecting AI Images

- Vet it the way you would any other image
- Backgrounds
- "How the %^&* did they do that?" if it seems totally impossible, it is
- Misaligned architecture, oddly curved walls, or unrealistic lighting.
- Sharp, overly rendered appearance
- Garbled text
- Illogical pieces of the image



Computers don't know how to make things imperfect.



Detecting AI Text

- Doesn't flow naturally
- Lots of big words
- patterns, repetitions, or identical sentence structures
- lack of coherence and natural transitions
- may neglect grammar and punctuaton rules
- very general information, no specifics

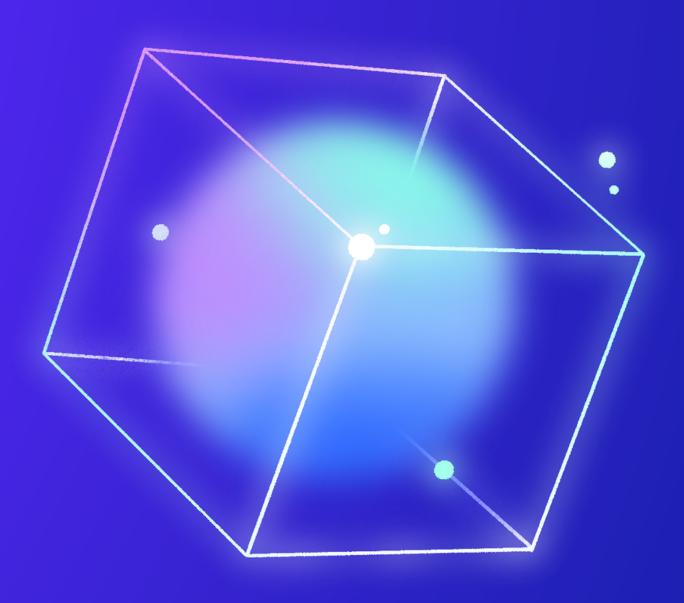

How can we make AI content better?

- Al Disclosure Act
 - To require generative artificial intelligence to disclose that their output has been generated by artificial intelligence, and for other purposes.
- White House Safety Accord



Blueprint for an AI Bill of Rights

- 1. developing safety and security standards for Al
- 2. safeguarding privacy
- 3. promoting equity and civil rights
- 4. advocating for consumer, patient, and student protection
- 5. supporting workers
- 6. fostering innovation and competition
- 7. advancing US leadership in AI technology
- 8. ensuring responsible and effective government use of Al



C2PA

The C2PA is a Joint Development Foundation project to collectively build an end-to-end open technical standard to provide publishers, creators, and consumers with opt-in, flexible ways to understand the authenticity and provenance of different types of media. C2PA opposes efforts to make content provenance measures mandatory.



SynthID

- Developed by Google
- Watermarks audio tracks, undetectable by human ear even when audio is compressed, sped up or down, or has extra noise added.
- Watermark images by embedding directly into the pixels, undetectable by human eyes.
- Not foolproof against extreme manipulations.



Meta

Facebook and its CEO, Nick Clegg, have announced a new approach to identifying and labeling AI-generated content on their platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, and Threads.





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
